

## **APPLICANTS WHO DO NOT RESIDE OR OWN PROPERTY IN THE GENOA CITY LIMITS**

### **NON-RESIDENT FEE CARDS**

To be eligible for a Genoa Public Library non-resident fee card, your principle residence must be in Genoa-Kingston Community Unit School District #424 and outside of any public library taxing area.

Any person who resides outside of the Genoa city limits and within the Genoa-Kingston school district may obtain a fee card by furnishing either one current photo ID or one non-photo ID or a piece of legal mail as proof of current residency and by paying the non-resident fee.

The fee is determined by multiplying the net taxable value of residential property appearing on the applicant's tax bill by the Library's current tax rate. (You can bring in your tax bill or we can look it up on the DeKalb County website to gather the net taxable value of your property.)

Payment of this fee provides individual or family library cards for a period of one year. This fee is non-refundable. To determine the fee, multiply the net taxable value by .0030804.

### **AGRICULTURAL NON-RESIDENTS**

Fee will be assessed on the parcel that the house is on.

### **NON-RESIDENT FEE CARDS FOR RENTERS**

The non-resident renter's fee is determined by multiplying the monthly rent by .15. The renter shall provide a current rent receipt or a cancelled check for verification.

### **TAX-EXEMPT NON-RESIDENTS**

Fee is calculated using the General Mathematical formula. This is the most efficient and fair way to assess the fee. Here is our calculation:  $\$233,907/5,193=\$45.04$  per capita x 2.86 average residents per household which equals \$128.82 for the cost of an annual household card.

### **SERVICES TO NON-RESIDENT CARDHOLDERS**

A valid non-resident card accords the cardholder all the services the library provides to its resident cardholders including reciprocal borrowing privileges.
